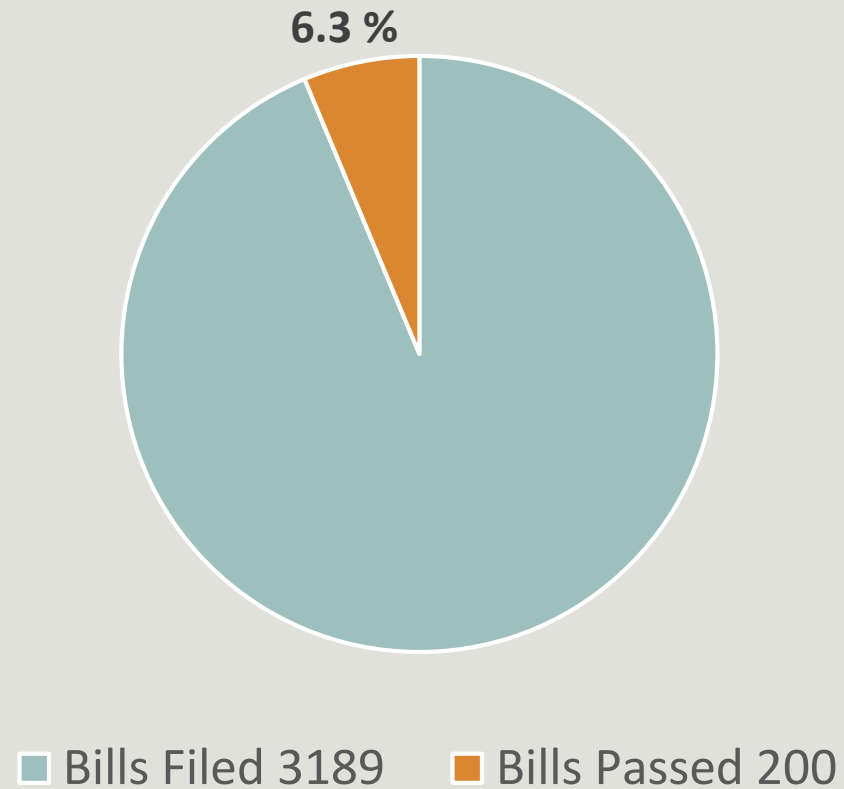


2018 Legislative Session Bill Statistics



Doc Stamp Exemption HB 7087

Legislative Change to Chapter 159: Clarifying Exemption from Doc Stamps for Housing Finance Authority (HFA) Loans

Started 2018 Session with two stand alone bills to address Doc Stamp Exemption – HB 607/SB 730

House Bill 607

- PASSED Local, Federal & Veterans Affairs Subcommittee

Senate Bill 730

- PASSED Community Affairs
- PASSED Appropriations Subcommittee on Finance and Tax

February/March 2018 - The House & Senate proposed Tax Packages which included the Doc Stamp Exemption bill language

March 11, 2018 - HB 7087 was PASSED by the Legislature

March 23, 2018 - Governor Scott signed the bill

July 1, 2018 – HB 7087 became Law
